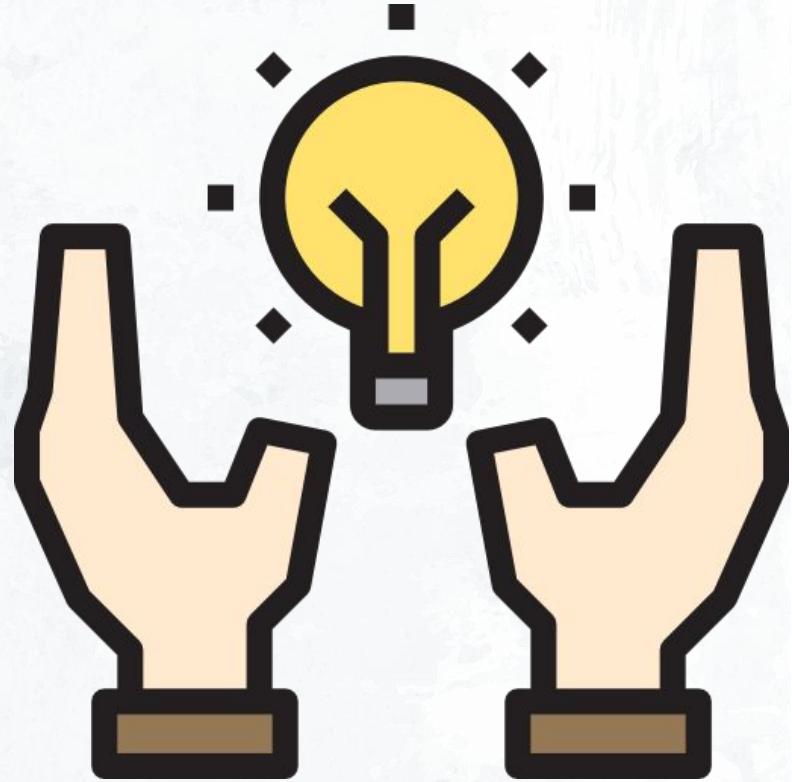


Combinaciones donde se usa el **GERUNDIO**

PASO A PASO



The gerundio (gerund) is a verb form that ends in "-ando" or "-iendo" in Spanish. It is used to express ongoing actions or continuous activities. Here are some common combinations where the gerundio is used:

Estar + gerundio (estar + gerundio): This combination is used to form the present progressive tense, which describes actions happening in the present.

Example:

Estoy comiendo. **(I am eating.)**

Está estudiando. **(He/she is studying.)**



Seguir + gerundio (seguir + gerundio): This combination expresses the idea of continuing or continuing to do something.

Example:

Sigo trabajando en mi proyecto. **(I continue working on my project.)**

Siguen practicando el piano. **(They continue practicing the piano.)**

Ir + gerundio (ir + gerundio): This combination indicates a gradual or progressive action.

Example:

Voy mejorando mi nivel de español. **(I am improving my Spanish level.)**

Vamos aprendiendo nuevas palabras. **(We are learning new words.)**



Venir + gerundio (venir + gerundio): This combination suggests a gradual or continuous action that is approaching or getting closer.

Example:

Viene corriendo hacia nosotros. **(He/she is coming running towards us.)**

Vienen cantando en el coche. **(They are coming singing in the car.)**

Andar + gerundio (andar + gerundio): This combination expresses an ongoing or continuous action.

Example:

Anda buscando trabajo. **(He/she is looking for a job.)**

Andamos paseando por el parque. **(We are strolling in the park.)**
